LIFE SAVING DEFIBRILLATOR IN BRIDGERULE

British Heart Foundation to give cardiac arrest victims fighting chance of survival in our Village!



Bridgerule is about to become a community of lifesavers. It is about to be fitted with a public access Defibrillator (PAD) and has also been awarded a Call Push Rescue training kit.

This life saving machine has been fully funded by The British Heart Foundation after a successful application from Sheila Cholwill on behalf of The Village Hall Committee.

The Community Package contains the innovative kit which includes everything needed to learn CPR in half an hour. The Village Hall Committee plan to run training sessions in the hall meaning everyone can become potential lifesavers.

We plan to have our first training session led by Paul Harrison a paramedic who has newly moved into our village accompanied by Graham Hodgson a local first responder on TUESDAY 28TH MARCH from 7.00PM IN THE HALL.

There are 10 dummies in the kit which can be used alongside our trainers so please come along if you can. We would like to train as many as possible on that date but if you cannot make this you will have another chance.

The defibrillator is a portable device that can be used by a member of the public to help restart the heart when someone has a cardiac arrest. This is when the heart stops pumping blood around the body and they lose consciousness almost at once. It's therefore imperative that the residents of Bridgerule know both of these vital steps to help someone in an emergency.

The British Heart Foundation believes defibrillators should be made more accessible and recognisable to the public and wish young people to be taught CPR and PAD awareness at school. Since launching the campaign in 2014 over 1.5 million people have joined the Nation of Lifesavers by learning lifesaving CPR. Sheila Cholwill said "I am delighted that we have been successful in our application for this lifesaving package and we are extremely grateful to The British Heart Foundation. The defibrillator will be fixed on the wall by the main entrance to the hall. This will mean that our residents will have the best possible chance of survival should they suffer a cardiac arrest. The hall committee are very keen that as many people as possible receive training in CPR and ask that wherever possible you attend our training sessions. Although we are not required to have specific training by members of the medical profession, as self training DVD's are included, it is felt that to have this expertise will be very advantageous.

Sara Askew, Head of Survival at The British Heart Foundation said that more lives could be saved if more defibrillators were available in public places and if more people felt confident using them and performing CPR. We are delighted that Bridgerule Village Hall Limited has joined

the British Heart Foundation's Nation of Lifesavers campaign by making another defibrillator available by the hall and teaching CPR locally.

- * if you receive an email bill check first with the supplier before making payment.
- * if your email is from the police with a notice of intention to prosecute check with them on 101, it's fraudulent (unless you know better)
- * phone call from your bank? Use another phone to call the bank.

There's only a few of them about but be wary always.

Finally, on **Tuesday April 18th at our village hall**, there is a meeting of Torridge Neighbourhood watch from 7-15 to 9 o'clock. Free refreshments beforehand. Police Sergeant David Monkton has been asked to speak. All are welcome.

APPEAL FOR WHO SHOT FELIX!



During the afternoon of Sunday 12 February our cat, Felix, was shot with an air gun. The pellet went into his stomach, perforating his gut in 6 places and causing an enormous amount of damage. Despite a long and complicated operation and the best efforts of all the staff at Penbode vets, Stratton, he passed away on 15 February. He suffered horribly for four days and we are heartbroken at both the pain he had to endure and his untimely death.

It is unfathomable to us as to how or why someone would think it is acceptable to shoot and maim an innocent creature. We absolutely understand that there are many ardent gardeners in the village and that, for many, cats may be thought a nuisance. It cannot however be considered a reasonable response to shoot cats. No matter that some may consider them nuisances, they are all loved and valued family members, as with any pet. What is even more shocking is that we have discovered that this is the third shooting of a cat in Bridgerule during the past two years. To some people three cats in two years may not seem a lot but surely even one is one too many. It sadly suggests that there may be an individual in our village that is ruthlessly targeting cats. Where does such cruelty stop?

There is however a silver lining to this distressing tale. We have over past days received so much positive feedback and support, some from people we have never previously met or barely know. This reassures us that despite the vicious actions of one person, there are very many more good hearted people in and around our village.

Finally, if you know anything at all about what happened on Sunday 12 February, or who may have committed this crime (because it is a crime), there is an ongoing police investigation. You can report your suspicions to the police confidentially on 101, quoting the crime reference number given in this edition's Neighbourhood Watch section. We would also ask that if anyone else's cat is injured in the future by being shot, please do report it to the police.

Our sincere thanks to all of the good people of Bridgerule, for their many good wishes and support.

Fundraising events at motor circuits by Christopher Darwin of Scotland Farm.

I started running these events by chance.

In March 2001 my wife Heather was sponsoring the Regis Classic Tour, an annual weekend classic car tour run by the ladies of Bognor Regis Motor Club to raise funds for breast cancer.

The tourists needed to drive round the Goodwood circuit at the start of their event, so I hired the circuit, let the tourists use it for an hour and then ran a track day. The track day drivers enjoyed themselves, £1400 was raised for the cause - and the drivers asked for more.

A 'track day' is an occasion when you can drive your own car at speed on a motor-racing circuit. It is definitely <u>not</u> a race, nor a sprint, nor a timed event - timing is not permitted. It is much better value than a competitive event in terms of 'cost per lap' and, when driven by everyone with self-discipline and consideration for other drivers, great fun.

Since 2001 I have run four or five track days every year; they have become a hobby in my retirement.

They are all for charity, there are no expenses apart from hire of the circuit – which is not cheap as it includes all the marshals etc and public liability insurance. Each event usually raises about £3000 and to date they have raised over £100,000 for various causes, ranging from cancer charities to those dealing with servicemen suffering from Post Traumatic Stress Disorder. The majority of the drivers are repeat business – they enjoy what I call 'Fun with a Purpose'.

Castle Combe circuit, near Chippenham, is the circuit nearest to Devon and which gives a most generous discount; the drivers pay roughly the commercial rate - £180 for the day, £100 for the half day. Llandow, west of Cardiff – a smaller and less expensive circuit – is also used. The days are usually sold out weeks in advance.

The number of entrants is limited to ensure maximum track time – about ten minutes every half hour – and minimize waiting time. I discourage obvious track cars, so there are no squadrons of 'recycled kamikazes' or Caterhams, but I do encourage classic cars as well as modern saloons and sports cars. There is always an interesting mix.

If a driver is new to track days, he or she is provided with a tutor, one of the experienced drivers. There is also an instructor available at £20 a session, which is a great help. As long as a driver uses the rear view mirror and invites faster cars to overtake only on the straights, the traffic flows smoothly.

Passengers are encouraged - drivers bring friends and people involved in the charity come as well. The drivers very much appreciate having these passengers as they can see that they are enjoying themselves.

My aim is to ensure the maximum amount of safe track time for all the drivers, whatever their experience of circuit driving. All supporters should know where their money went; I therefore publish the accounts within days of the event which are sent to all drivers, anyone who contributed and anyone who asks.

I have never been a racing driver. I served in the Royal Navy for twelve years and then worked in civil aviation. I used to do some marshalling at Goodwood circuit and I worked in Heather's pitlane when she was racing.

I do not claim to be better than any other organizer. It is just that these days are a bit different. Bring your car and find out for yourself; most of the drivers are now regulars, but <u>all</u> were beginners once.

20 HOLSWORTHY GOLF CLUB—80 YEARS OLD AND STILL GOING STRONG

Holsworthy Golf Club began in 1937 as the result of a Solicitor from Holsworthy, Stanley Rowland, being invited to join Bude & N Cornwall Golf Club but his good friend William Coombe could not as he was engaged in 'trade' – William Coombe was the owner of several successful gentlemen's outfitters which still continues in Holsworthy under his name today. Stanley Rowland was so annoyed by this that he decided that it was time for Holsworthy to have its own golf club.



A very poor piece of land was bought for £600 and a nine hole course was plotted by the then Professional at Westward Ho! Casual labour was used for cutting the tees & greens. For the clubhouse, an old beach hut was purchased for £1. A subscription of

Two Guineas was set with a green fee of 1/6d and Holsworthy Golf Club was open for business.

Dormy House on the corner of the land was bought by Mr Beer, a retiring farmer who then became the clubs groundsman until he was well over 90 years old; cutting the rough using a scythe and using the same grip for his golf swing!

During World War 11 the club was ordered to put the course to food production with the fairways being ploughed up but it was almost a total failure with very little food growing. The Clubhouse became a retreat for the on duty Home Guard who were diligently protecting Holsworthy from invasion. Luckily the threat did not materialise and in practice any parachutist landing on the golf course would probably have been immobilised by the mud!

Several of our village residents enjoy playing golf regularly on the course at Holsworthy. This photograph was taken after a recent competition and includes Kevin Bowditch, Bob Horton, Barry Marshall, Tony Houghton and Chis Hitchings.



Through the years Holsworthy Golf Club has changed immeasurably, growing from a 9 hole to an 18 hole course. A new clubhouse has been built and countless golf tournaments have been held here including a Pro Am tournament in 1999 but the biggest change is that the club is no longer a members club having been bought by four local business men Mike Bridgman, Mark Bellew, Will Urquhart and David Prouse in 2014.

Holsworthy Golf Club has always maintained its reputation for being one of the friendliest clubs in Devon. The atmosphere in the clubhouse (especially on a Thursday when the Seniors play!) is filled with tales of rounds of golf and laughter when daft things happen on the course such as the crows pinching the players golf balls! It is a thriving golf club with a growing membership of all ages and abilities. Joe, the PGA Professional, is always on hand to give lessons and advice and he has been working closely with local schools encouraging youngsters into the game.



The restaurant is fast gaining a reputation for good food with our Sunday Carvery leading the way. Foodie Nights are always popular, offering the diner the chance to try menus from all around the world. The clubhouse is a great venue and is now used very regularly for all types of events from weddings to bingo!



We pride ourselves on our 'Open to All' policy and look forward to welcoming you in the near future either on the golf course or in the clubhouse.

Dear Sirs/Madam,

AVIAN INFLUENZA (BIRD FLU) OUTBREAK IN THE UK As you will be aware there have been a number of Avian Influenza outbreaks in the UK and a Prevention Zone was declared in December that covers the whole of the UK.

The prevention zone means that all poultry keepers – whether on a commercial scale or simply a small backyard flock – are now required by law to house them (keep them under cover) or otherwise keep them separate from wild birds. This requirement (the Prevention Zone) has now been extended until 28 February 2017. They have also banned gatherings of poultry across the UK.

It is also important that poultry keepers must continue to keep a close watch on the health of their birds, and take steps to reduce the risk of infection via the environment, for example in wild bird droppings, by practising good biosecurity. You should do this even if your birds are inside. If they are concerned it is important that they contact their Vet.

This has been necessary because the same Avian Flu strain has also been found in wild birds in England, Scotland and Wales. DEFRA have taken this action to reduce the risks and help protect poultry and captive birds from avian flu.

Although we have been putting the message out on social media, not everyone uses or looks at a computer. So to help us get this very important message to get out to everyone we would ask if something could be included in the parish magazine and/ or put up in the village to raise awareness.

The Food Standards Agency advise that bird flu does not pose a food safety risk for UK consumers. Properly cooked poultry and poultry products, including eggs, are safe to eat.

National Mills Weekend

The Bridge Mill at Bridgerule, near Holsworthy, has participated in this event since 1997 and is planning a day of special events to celebrate this 20th anniversary.

The Mill will open on Sunday, 14th May from 11am until 4pm,

Grinding organic wholemeal flour in the traditional way between millstones driven by water power, with stewards stationed on each floor to explain how it all works. Outside the mill, there'll be Morris Dancing by the Lodestone Border Morris team, and the Bridge Mill's very own song written and performed by local musician Phil Williams; plus madrigals and other songs by Bude Choral Society, Bradworthy Baroque, and the Tamarside Singers of Bridgerule. Annual features include the mammoth plant sale, local craft stalls, and a slide show of The Mill restoration, while refreshments and light lunches are served all day. Entrance is £3 per adult, 50p per child.
