Derril Water solar park

Update:

Since the last update from Derril Water, Ripple Energy entered administration and is now being wound down. Ripple was providing management services to the cooperative society that owns the Derril Water Solar Park and had designed the novel ownership structure that allowed for coop members to receive savings on their electricity bills according to how much power their share of the solar park generated.

Ripple's demise does not affect the ownership of the solar park. Nor will it affect the construction programme. And nor will it affect the coop's commitment to providing the community benefit fund associated with the project.

RES continues to provide project construction management services to the project which is due to start generating power on behalf of 9,000 households that make up the membership of the coop. The project is fully funded with project finance from Virgin Money and specific accounts are in place to cover restoration obligations at the end of the project's life.

On site, the directional drilling under the road connecting the two halves of the solar park has completed, and the substation building is nearing completion. The last of the panel mounting structures will be installed following the demobilisation of the temporary site compounds

Through the course of May there will be a lot of milestones to achieve. In particular there will be extensive testing of cables, inverters and transformers in advance of energisation of the grid connection. Works will then progress to commissioning the full site in preparation for the operational phase starting in the summer. While all these activities are vital for the completion of the construction phase, they are electrical in nature, so activity on site may be less perceptible.

A possible retrograde step into the future!

Neighbourhood Watch Notes

What consternation! You would have to visit a distant hospital like Barnstaple if that hospital wanted a blood test, now that the Ruby County surgery in Holsworthy will not take blood for onward transmission to hospitals. That was the only option.

However, Holsworthy hospital will now take the blood for transfer to whichever hospital requires it. Each of the hospitals has their day for blood to be taken. Barnstaple, Torrington and Bideford, for example, have their individual days at Holsworthy. If you are asked for a blood sample you have to make an appointment with Holsworthy Hospital. Don't just turn up. The phone number is 01395 519922 - an Exeter number. You can't just turn up.

Have you invested in the Ripple Solar Farm, otherwise known as Derril Water Solar Farm ? They have reportedly appointed insolvency specialists to place the company into administration. In old fashioned terms they have gone bust. But work still goes on building new stanchions for solar panels.

And now the latest, but not new, scam. Ticket sales for concerts and events. Don't lose your money by getting tickets from other than the box office or well-known ticketing websites. Check they belong to STAR, an organisation that has signed up for dispute resolution. Visit "<u>star.org.uk/buy_safe</u>". If you think you have been scammed report it to 0300 123 2040 or "<u>actionfraud.police.uk</u>".

If you are approached by a couple in a supermarket car park, take extreme care. One talks but the other may steal your wallet or handbag.

Finally - in the decent weather to come don't let yourself suffer burglary. Keep things tight and lit up at night. Doors, windows, cars and sheds etc locked up when you're not about. Don't let anyone unknown in to your property.

Hilary has lived in our village for a number of years. She fully commits to our village whenever she can and very much enjoys amongst other things going out walking.

Hilary continues:-

I have had a very varied and interesting career in nursing and midwifery starting as a student nurse in Torbay hospital at the age of 18 years and ending up as a practice nurse at various general practitioner surgeries around Mere in Wiltshire where I lived until I retired at the age of?

There were some tasks as a student nurse I did not enjoy however. The main one being collecting tooth mugs of false teeth and cleaning them

"trying" to make sure the right ones were returned to the right pot!! Yet I loved the medical wards where you really got to know everyone and hopefully see them improve. I also heard swear words I didn't know existed but that was mainly from the motor-bike boys....

After my midwifery training in Bristol and then Winchester (excellent walks) I found my niche especially enjoying my tie with the community with my bike assisting with a lot of the confinements and requiring to clean a few baths of coal when the need arose.

For reasons not understood by my family, I Volunteered as a V.S.O. (Volunteered Services Overseas) after a



year in Jersey. I put a pin the world map and ended up in India. However, V.S.O. Headquarters sent me to Malawi in Africa. I did a months course with the other fourteen volunteers in London learning about the country, customs and interesting politics and warned about the dangers of being deported. The language course was very good and I was useless making the lovely Malawian tutor laugh every time we did role play - he called me a typical passive Malawian!

Cultural shock! Oh yes, but I loved the country and the people from the start. We were (2 of us until she left) based in Nkhoma, a Scottish and South African mission with a lovely surgical block built with money from the World Council of Churches. The rest of time spent there was where I led the midwifery team and my Canadian pal the Children's Unit. We were kept very busy and I did the midwifery teaching as well, up to our United Kingdom standards and exams. I had 2 sets of lovely students. As much as I loved the work, the people here were very poor and under nourished with many mothers for the young to be having babies ending with many coming in with ruptured uterus etc from the village with subsequent very sad outcomes. Despite it all they were friendly and generous and always gave a smile.

However, we did our best with educating (the students soon learnt what information to impart in a nice way) the people and getting them as fit as

we could encouraging family spacing (Family Planning was not allowed by President Banda) and immunisations.

I could go on and on but I wont, suffice to say I felt we had at least passed on our knowledge to the next generation and hope that this very poor land locked country could start to raise more healthy children. However, not that many years later it was blighted by HIV/Aids...

On a final note of interest I remember well and can now laugh about. I was doing a large ante-natal clinic with some students when everyone ran outside. Then I saw this wild eyed Malawian man holding up my little Brownie camera and saying he had a present for me. How kind..... He pulled a live snake out of his mouth, The watchman hurried in and took the man, my camera (full of mud) and the snake went somewhere too!!! I then called everyone back in and resumed my clinic as you do!

Thank you for Malawi for a wonderful 2 years. I made many of you friends and I learnt a lot from you all. 1973-1975.

I now find myself back in beautiful Devon. How lucky am I!!
